GUEST EDITORIAL

COMING TO TERMS WITH ALZHEIMERS

Is it my imagination that this terrible affliction is becoming more prevalent or is it that I have just arrived at the time zone whereby many people suffer from this disease often associated with advancing years. It seems to me that almost everyone I know has someone in their family, or at least in their circle of friends, who is affected by dementia or Alzhelmers. I don't believe there is any difference between the two, in fact they can be referred to as either / or. I can write with some authority in the subject as my husband Jack is a victim and has been the source of great distress to the whole family. The condition can take many forms and has no cure. Deterioration of the brain can be very gradual and can be virtually unnoticed for some years, as in Jack's case, although in hindsight the signs are always there.

Eventually I became concerned enough to enlist the help of our GP when Jack was due for his doctor's certificate for his mandatory 75 year health check. The late Dr Murphy rang me immediately and described his findings as 'very alarming'. The outcome was Jack could not get his drivers licence renewed and of course this was greeted with extreme disbelief and anger from him. Needless to say all this was my fault and I had to bear the brunt of all his abuse and anger. A subsequent drivers test produced even more anger and abuse from him as in his opinion all those people were a pack of wankers with me at the top of the list. Of course it now became necessary to hide all the car keys and his motorbike keys. At least this kept him occupied for the next couple of weeks as he turned the house upside down searching for them.

His behaviour became more and more bizarre and he now did not believe this was his home and that we lived 'somewhere down the road miles away'. Day after day he pestered me to take him home. He packed and unpacked his Landcruiser to the rafters each day with all his belongings, even his pushbike, pictures off the walls, tins of fruit and spaghetti, gumboots etc etc. There was no point in trying to reason with him and I could only humour him and tell him we would go tomorrow.

Without the support of our adult children I could certainly not have coped.

The outcome of all this was a final assessment at the Henry Bennett Centre. To get him there was to tell a story of white lies and subterfuge. After a 2 ½ hour interrogation which resulted in much angst from Jack the outcome was something of a shock to me instead of relief when they told me he would have to remain there until transferred to Rossendale Home for the rest of his life. I knew I could no longer cope with him but the realisation that he was never coming home again was almost too much to bear.

Rossendale Home is regarded as the top of the range and I can only endorse that the facilities are excellent and more importantly the staff, in the main, are caring and do a wonderful job. So now some three years plus down the track, with the natural progression of the condition, Jack is reduced to no more than a zombie. He can no longer walk and is strapped in to his arm chair (for his own safety I must add) day after day. He cannot speak an intelligible word, cannot feed himself, does not recognise me or the family, cannot look at or comprehend the TV or look at a magazine or photograph album, is incontinent and sits all day, day after day, virtually Waiting for God.

I guess at this point I could be forgiven for asking the question WHERE IS GOD?



BEE POLLEN ROYAL JELLY



BEE POLLEN

EUREKA FARM DISCUSSIONGROUP

Our last group was held at Matt Clausens property on Kiroa Road. A good turn out and lots to talk about. We had Veterinarian Katie Denholm from the Animal Health Centre to talk to us about the in calf program. Although early in the season to be talking about this as most farms are very short of feed and cow condition is below par.Katie was able to come up with dollar amounts of how much it costs us to not get out a good 6 week in calf rate and so we can see how much money we could afford to spend on feed to make sure grass cover and cow condition were at a reasonable level at start of calving. There was some good discussion on this subject with varying opinions on what was the most profitable way about going about this.

We went for a good walk through the farm looking at the pastures. There was a wide range in quality from 2yr AR1 pasture out of maize still in good condition to some paddocks that were stuffed. We had a few different ideas on what to do with these paddocks and ways to go about undersowing. Matt was planning to follow behind the cows undersowing all paddocks that needed it. The cows looked very good considering the season we have been through and it looked like things were being well planned for the season ahead.

The next discussion group is to be held on June 8th at a venue to be arranged.

LADIES BRING A PLATE

It's the time of year when everyone is trying to give away feijoas.

A very versatile fruit and certainly when in season there is an abundance of them. I got this feijoa muffin recipe from our Editor and I can say I have made them. They are easy to make and very light and tasty.

Feijoa Muffins

Combine

3/4 cup sugar

1 1/2 tsp ginger

1 cup sultanas

1/2 tsp baking powder

1 % cups flour

3 - 5 large feijoas

In a bowl blend

100g melted butter


1/2 cup milk

1 egg

1 tsp baking soda

Pour it over the dry ingredients and just combine. Bake at 180c for 20-25 mins.

When the feijoa season is over other fruit can be used. E.g. pears.





Proof of Drought Impact

The following production data of an actual farm in North Waikato makes very interesting, if not palatable, reading. It is interesting for the picture it paints and probably puts on paper what each of you have been dealing with on farm.

Table 1 below shows 7 years worth of farm production data and the effects of the last 3 dry summers compared with the 4 previous ones on an actual farm. Very little has changed on the farm over that time period apart from Drought, Black Beetle and some bought in supplement in the last 2 years.

56ha farm milking 200 jersey cows

07/08 saw a 20% reduction in production. They dried off early (March) but did not buy in any feed. However in the last 2 years an average 90t of PKE has been purchased and if this was not fed I calculate that the last 2 years would also have seen a 20% reduction in production due to the drought compounded by Black Beetle damage. As it is the last 3 years have averaged 14% less production for this farm.

In summary the total impact of the drought can be summarised as:-

- 1) Lost production \$52,000/yr
- 2) Bought in Feed, \$23,000/yr
- 3) Regrassing costs. \$5,000/yr

A total cost for this small farm of \$80,000/yr or \$400/cow. Expanded out to a more typical sized farm of 350 cows it is easy to see where 'costs' of the drought in the order of \$100,000 to \$150,000 / farm / year come from.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

A reminder that Open Days (consultation sessions) around subdivision and development in rural areas are being held in late May and early June. (Refer to the press release from Council on the next page with the relevant dates for residents of Eureka Ward).

As I mentioned previously these open days are to discuss proposed changes with the community. For example - Council is promoting a change to Plan Change 7 where the parent lot must be 6 hectares before a land owner can subdivide one additional lot whereas under Plan Change 7 in its present form the parent lot must start at 2.6 hectares with two additional lots permitted. I would very much like a good turnout at the sessions to give the Policy Planners your feedback on this and other proposed changes. I will be attending both Matangi and Gordonton open days.

Over three days last week we heard 141 submissions to the **Annual Plan** and after a further day of deliberations decided on a 2,96% increase to existing ratepayers - \$184.62 per \$100,000 of capital value with a Uniform Annual Charge of \$463.00 per rating unit.

If you like to explore new walking areas you may like to visit the *Pukemokemoke* (*David Johnstone*) *Bush Reserve* on Tauhei Road next to the Tauhei Quarry. This reserve is a 40 hectare remnant of lowland forest and contains over 250 native plant species, including large matal, kauri, totara, rimu and kahlkatea. A network of tracks allows you to explore the area and gives access to a lookout platform at the site of the old trig station (20 minutes to the summit). There is a gazebo shelter with a water tank at the log hauler site.

We have had to extend the **dog pound** in Brownlea Street, Ngaruawahia to cater for the increasing number of strays being impounded. The extension is costing around \$152,000.

Last month Council heard four days of submissions on the *Te Kauwhata Structure Plan*. Areas will be created for urban living within this plan. Land for subdivision is becoming increasingly sought after in Te Kauwhata because of its proximity to Auckland and the new facilities being created around the area e.g. sports park, landfill, Springhill Prison. After consideration of the submissions and after receiving additional information we have met this week to endeavour to finalise the draft and the final plan will be voted on at the June meeting of the Policy Committee.

On 25th May we start work on the **Raglan Structure Pian** which includes consideration of economic and consequential urban growth of the area.

Public Open Days

Subdivision and development in rural areas

The population of the Waikato District is expected to double in the next 50 years to 88,000 people in 36,500 homes. As this growth will impact on a range of factors, including the environment, the infrastructure and the patterns of settlement across the district needs to be well managed and sustainable for both current and future generations.

The Waikato District Growth Strategy outlines how the district will manage growth in the future and the growth strategy to be implemented over time through the District Plan. Much of the Waikato District is productive farmland, complemented by outstanding landscapes and coastlines. The Growth Strategy signals that the productive potential of rural land, and the district's unique landscapes, coastline and cultural assets, should be preserved and promoted.

It is important we revitalise and plan for the growth of our towns and villages to encourage population growth in these areas.

Using infrastructure efficiently and safeguarding the productive potential of rural land means some tightening of the District Plan rules for subdivision and development in rural areas needs to be considered.

How will any changes affect me?

Council is currently reviewing the subdivision and residential development provisions in the Proposed Walkato District Plan for rural and coastal areas. Some changes are proposed to the existing rules for the Rural and Coastal zones and to the policy framework.

A number of open days are scheduled for Council to discuss these changes with the community and to give the opportunity for feedback and suggestions on how our rural areas should be managed.






