A Week On Stewart Island

Sheryll and I spent a wonderful week on Stewart Is. From 7 - 14 March 2011. It was a busy week tramping, fishing, Kiwi spotting.

We rented a house at Oban, the main centre, for our stay and all things were within walking distance. There is a regular Ferry crossing from Bluff and numerous flights each day from Invercargill airport.



We first did a half day fishing and Patterson inlet Tour and rather quickly caught enough Blue Cod to last us the week. We then visited the reserve at Ulva Is. This has been a reserve for 100 years. The bird song was great as it was in most parts of the Island we visited. Bellbird, Tui, Kaka, Wood pigeon were the most common. We then visited the site of a former Norwegian Camp and Boatyard where they maintained the whaling chase boats that fished in the Ross Sea, Antarctica, around 1930. A slipway, large shed and House and accommodation were set up to maintain these 30m vessels that fed the motherships with whales for processing. The venture was short lived having a duration of only 5 years.

The next morning we flew across the Island in a small plane to land on the beach at Mason's Bay. An interesting flight, thankfully in unusually calm conditions. We walked part of the long beach with huge sand dunes formed by the very strong South and Southwesterly winds on this exposed beach. We began our 17.5 km walk back across the island over low swampy flat land, farmed as a sheep farm until around 1970s. The DOC hut had plenty of residents, 13 had seen Kiwis in the wild the night before!

We then walked past the DOC Rangers house, the former farm house, which was well presented in its original condition. The Ranger was happy to show us through and was proud that the temperature gauge on the coal range still worked. Great those Shacklocks weren't they. On past the old woolshed, yards and sheep dip station. Then time to get some kilometers done as we have to meet a boat at 4.30 or walk another 15km home. The walk was easy flat but due to swamp there was no forest or large trees. Flax, Titree and swamp grasses everywhere. We made Freshwater River in good time. Another DOC hut here with plenty of people again. There was also a group of track workers heading out to town for the first time in



10 Days. An interesting water taxi ride out of the river, about 7 km of winding narrow river at 20 Knots, into Patterson inlet which can only be accessed at high tide. Then a beautiful ride in calm sea up the Patterson inlet to Golden Bay and a further 2 km walk home. A welcome Beer tonight! The next day we rented scooters and rode over nearly all the 27 km of roads on the Island. The beaches and bays on the island are beautiful, golden sand and clear water and very large kelp grows from the rocks.

Tonight we assembled at 8.30 pm to hopefully see Kiwi in the wild. The Skipper advised they had not missed seeing Kiwi on these trips in the past 2 years! After a 35 min boat ride across Patterson inlet we stopped at a jetty with 16 hopeful Kiwi spotters and a Guide. Well, 7 different Kiwi later, we arrived back. The Kiwi come on to the beach at night to feed on Sand Hoppers and other beach bugs. We watched one for 10-15 minutes, feeding 3-4 m away, happily feeding under the guides torchlight while we 16 watched. On our way back to the boat we got close and personal to another kiwi beside the track, happily feeding and not the least concerned at the 17 people watching.

Stewart Island Kiwi feed in the day time as well as night time and are the largest of the Kiwi Species. Stewart Island Kiwi mate for life, share the nesting responsibilities and foster their young for up to 2 years. This is unlike the North Island Kiwi who abandon chicks soon after birth.

This was an absolute highlight for me, seeing Kiwi in the wild, no tags or transmitters and no artificial feeding. Home to bed at midnight.

Around Oban there are many bush walks from 15 min to 3-4 hours. We did most of these from our house and return around various beaches and bush tracks.





We walked with Denise Irvine and friends on the first day of their three day Stewart Island walk. This was to Port William Hut where we would be picked up by water taxi at 4 pm. We walked over several beautiful beaches and through some wonderful bush with very large Rimu trees prevalent. The section from Maori Bay to Port William was a great example of rainforest with large trees, lots of moss, lichen, ferns, Rata vines, Beech trees and the Rimu. This track is one of the NZ Great Walks. Another one ticked off for Denise. Finishing our day with a lovely boat ride back around the coast to Oban.

On our last day we walked local walks a gain and readied for an early departure in the morning.

A wonderful place to visit, a week was not too long as we were always busy. They have a 4Square Store at Oban that sell everything and a pub that sells 'Waikato'! Just another reminder for us that we truly have world class places to visit right here in NZ.

It didn't take long and the crew of 18 was filling the bin at a great amount of knots. Snapper were the main species on offer but there were some nice sized Trevally and some rat kings around to tangle a few lines. After about an hour or so and one big fish bin full the skipper was keen for us to count the fish to see how many more we were allowed. About 30 more left to catch, the size limit just went up. It was only 9:30 in the morning. I think more fish went back in the water than in the bin after that. So we dragged out those last 30 fish for as long as possible and at 10:15 we were off back to the wharf. A statistician on the boat worked out that a fish went in the bin every 45 seconds, not bad going for a bunch of busy farmers with no time to get out fishing.

It had been a great morning and now it was back to my cowshed to fillet up the 162 snapper and seven Trevelly. We obviously have a few people in our group who have a second job as fish filleters as the fish were dealt to in no time. We smoked a couple of the big ones for a snack followed by a few fresh fillets on the bbq as we supped on a beer or two.

It was an awesome day out and fun had by all; looking forward to seeing you all at the next discussion group - I'm sure you will all be there as early as you were for the fishing trip.

IN YOUR GARDEN

10 top tasks for April/May

- Beat thrips. If you didn't spray to control thrips in summer, your evergreen viburnums and rhodos are probably turning silver now. Cut them back to remove unsightly foliage while the weather is still warm enough for new foliage to be produced.
- Chill out tulips. Pop tulip bulbs in the fridge for up to eight weeks. A cold snap helps them produce big flowers on long stems. Store in paper bags so they don't
- Plant now primulars, polyanthus, cyclamen, cinerarias, ranunculus, iceland poppies and stock
- Sow sweet peas. These are best sown in autumn at the foot of a sunny wall or supporting tepee or trellis. Add compost and lime, keep moist until germination, then only water if soil dries out.
- 5. Plant winter greens, cabbage, try wintercross and of course savoy and broccoli. Plant in full sun in a well drained fertile soil. Cauliflower is excellent all year round. Watch out for slugs, snails and caterpillars. Caulis mature in about 70 days. Celery needs to be in full sun in a frost free area. Also grows well in a greenhouse. Spinach and silverbeet.
- Citrus aid –Are your trees spindly with sooty leaves or scabby fruit? Sooty mould is caused by aphids or scale – spray with conqueror oil and follow with copper spray in spring.
- Hydrangea health Deadhead and spray with conqueror oil for white scale (spotted white mounds of soft cotton on the undersides of the leaves)
- 8. Clever cutbacks Give perennials a good clip around the ears. Deadhead perennials that have come to the end of their display. Take out all diseased or twiggy growth, lift and divide cannas, delphiniums and phlox now but don't overdo it. Tall perennials such as salvias are coming to the end of the season, but leave the seedheads on for winter structure and bird fodder.
- Snail watch get them before they get your plants, especially renga renga lillies and new annuals.
- 10. Prepare to plant native trees to cut your carbon footprint, but do your research first as to how tall they grow and pick an appropriate site so they don't steal the sun from the rest of the garden

Feijoas are in abundance right now and thankfully there are many ways to use them. Here are my two favorites a crumble and a cake.

FEIJOA, GINGER AND ALMOND CRUMBLE -serves 4

8-10 large feijoas 1 tsp baking powder 40g ground almonds I Tbs butter plus 60g extra for topping

1 Tbs honey 2 Tbs finely chopped crystallized ginger

100ml dessert wine 60g flour

1/3cup brown sugar cream or ice-cream to serve

Preheat oven to 200c. Peel and slice the feijoas. Butter a baking dish with the tablespoon of butter. Place the feijoas in the dish drizzle with honey then pour over the dessert wine. Make the crumble topping by mixing the brown sugar, baking powder, ground almonds and ginger. Rub the butter into the flour with your fingertips until crumbly with visible small pieces of butter. Combine the butter mixture with the sugar and almond mixture then spoon over the feijoas. Bake for approx 30 minutes or until golden and bubbling. Serve hot with cream or vanilla ice-cream

CINNAMON FEIJOA CRUMBLE CAKE

125g butter softened & chopped 34 cup caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract 2 eggs

1 cup plain flour sifted I tsp baking powder, sifted

1 tsp ground cinnamon 1/2 cup milk 1 1/2 tbsp ground almonds (I use extra flour if I don't have any)

6-8 peeled and chopped feijoas

Crumble Topping

1/2 cup plain flour 1 1/2 tbsp brown sugar

1/4 tsp baking powder 60g butter, softened and chopped Preheat oven to 160c. To make the crumble topping, combine the flour, sugar and baking powder in a bowl. Add the butter and use your fingertips to rub it into the flour mixture.

Beat the butter, sugar and vanilla with an electric mixer until pale and creamy. Gradually add eggs and beat well. Add the flour, baking powder, cinnamon and ground almonds and beat to combine. Fold through the milk and feijoas. Line the base of a lightly greased 20 cm round spring from cake tin with non-stick baking paper and spoon in cake mixture. Top with crumble topping and bake for 1 hour 10 minutes or until cooked when tested with a skewer. Allow to cool in tin.

Feijoas freeze well. If you have plenty of freezer space you can freeze them whole. Other wise, cut of the skin and freeze the fruit to use for pureeing, baking or throwing into your morning smoothie, long after the season has ended.

ARNICA

Arnica montana L

Arnica is a herb I always have in the house as it is invaluable for any injury as it prevents swelling, brings out bruises and also helps reduce pain. My family love sports and motorbikes so it gets a lot of us when they injure themselves to the extent they ask for it as they know how it really helps. I use Arnica in the spray form (Homeopathy – in a very diluted form) which I spray on the area and also 4 sprays in the mouth, it should not be used on broken skin but can be sprayed out from the broken skin area.

The plant has been used medicinally in Europe since the sixteenth century. European physicians prescribed it as a stimulant, particularly for the heart and circulation, an overdose of an extract from the plant can cause painful irritation of the stomach and intestines and can increase blood pressure. Arnica in infinitesimally tiny doses, is to this day the standard homeopathic remedy for shock occasioned by a sudden painful injury. The best way to use arnica is as an ingredient in salves and liniments or as I do a homeopathic spray.



CONSTITUENTS: Essential oil (thymol), sesquiterpene lactones (arnicin, helenalin) flavonoids, polysaccharides, inulin, carotenoids, tannins.

IN 1751 Briton – John Hill in his herbal – lamented that arnica was "greatly recommended by ancients but much neglected by present day practice". It was, however, well known in Germany where, in the 18th century, Johann Wolfgang von Geothe credited arnica for saving his life when it relieved the anginal attacks he suffered from hardening of the arteries. In Germany more than 100 different drug preparations contain arnica flowers and sometimes the leaf.

Arnica is not usually used internally except in Homeopathic dosages and also should not be used before and operation but fine after an operation.

WORD FROM JAPAN

Sometimes you find out the most interesting things about people who live in Eureka.

Last week Sue Edmonds discovered that Harold Woolford began a penfriend correspondence with a Japanese lady, Atsuko Kimura, forty-one years ago. His daughter Jean Derby has been keeping it up for the last twenty years.

They had received a letter from Atsuko dated 11 April, following on from the big 11 March Japanese earthquake, and felt people might be interested to hear what it has been like for someone living near Tokyo. Atsuko has very good English, but we've used her version as written. Here it is:

"Following the NZ earthquake we had a greate disaster by tsunami, earthquake and nuclear crisis. Nobody think of such a violent quake hit

us on March 11. I can't describe the scene of destroyed towns and villages on the coast area after I watched TV news. I keep watching TV since then and read newspaper every day, even today (Atsuko also sent newspaper clippings showing photos before and after the devastation)

I was very lucky my place (apartment in Tokyo) hasn't hit directly but I had a big quake at my father's house (in Kanagawa Prefecture). I sit down quickly under the kitchen table for 5 or 6 minutes, soon after that I turned on TV and know what was happened. I have no word to describe about that.

My brother came here next day to stay for 8 days as the water supply stoped in his area, and his wife went to her mother's house in Tokyo. My nieces were in a big trouble of transportation and had a hard time to reach homes late at night.

Nuclear crisis seems worse day by day. I really give my deepest sympathies those people involved in agriculture and fishing and seafood products workers. Hundreds of volunteer people help and support affected people in evacuate centers and shelters.

We very much appreciate that rescue teams from over hundred of foreign countries came quickly. They worked very hard every day. Thank to their help and support Japan is saved and will get through this disaster soon.

Reconstruction is going on and the life line is almost rebuilt and a lot of temporary housing is setting up now.

Many people moved to the other prefectures where their relatives and friends live and to the new place to homestay. School resumed last week, but complete reconstruction will take long time. We thank NZ team helped us and a lot of heartfelt messages from all over the world. I watched these news with tear. We wish polluted air and seawater by radioactive contaminants will not spread any more. I really pray that to God. The only thing I can do is the contribution for affected people.

My apartment building and residents are all safe, but I couldn't go there for a while due to less operation of train. We have to save electricity so it's dark in every super markets, public buildings and inside the train with no heater. This phenomenon is new to us. I wrote only about disaster today."







Smiles for Miles

It's been a great Autumn! Firstly the Eureka Discussion Group fishing trip was amazing with the snapper quota, of 162, caught in just over 2 hours. Thanks to Brett Gordon for doing a great job organising it. Secondly it's been an Autumn 'out of the box' for pasture growth. Can anyone remember an Autumn as good as this one?

Average pasture covers are a good 500kg DM/ha more than the same time last year. In fact probably the last 3 years. AND we have an excellent Milk Price to go with it! No wonder I see so many smiles and happy farmers on my travels.

How long to milk for?

With everything looking so good most farmers will be milking into May. This is certainly a change from the previous 3 seasons. The drying off decisions don't change though. It is still based on a consideration of cow condition, ability to achieve desired 'calving' average pasture covers by early June, expected pasture growth rates and supplement on hand. Formalise the picture by doing a feed budget for your farm. This will give you increased confidence about the decisions you make. 
Face to Face



Facial Eczema Risk

The week of bad weather we are now experiencing at the end of April does mean the Facial Eczema spore numbers which have been dropping should fall some more.



This graph generated just before Easter shows the spore counts falling, though they still remain high in some areas.

As the table above shows there is quite a variation across the district but high spore counts (anything over 80) are still being found which means they could be still high spore counts on your farm.

The bottom line is you need to continue with Facial Eczema protection for your stock.

Copper - when to give it

If copper, in the form of copper sulphate powder, injections or bullets is given to stock while the FE spores are still about, then the toxin in the spores becomes more dangerous. For this reason if you are intending to give your stock copper it is best to wait until after the FE season has passed. This is unless you are

using proteinated copper which is safe to give at this time of the year. Unfortunately the presence of high levels of zinc, used to protect the animals from the FE toxin, does inhibit the normal uptake of copper. So animals which have had a lot of zinc will have low liver copper stores.

Cattle and sheep and hinds pass copper across the placenta into the developing foetus. This is to ensure the newly born animal will have enough copper for the first few months of life as there is no copper at all in the milk. This means it is important the mother has sufficient liver stores. For the cow it means liver copper concentrations should be above 400 micromol/kg fresh tissue as it goes into the winter. Have liver samples taken from any cows which you cull and send to the works to work out your herd's copper status.

Normal Foetus Loss

A New Zealand study found that for every 100 cows mated 90 would become pregnant. But after 21 days only 65 were still pregnant. At 56 days, 60 of the original 90, were still pregnant. And then only 58 cows actually calved to that mating. These losses, believe it or not, are considered normal.

Sometimes it is difficult to know if empty cows turning up late in the season is "normal" or not.

If you are concerned about the number of abortions or "empty" cows give us a ring and discuss your situation with us.
