



#### LADIES A PLATE

#### Zucchini pie

3 cups grated zucchini

1 onion grated

4 eggs

1 1/2 cups grated cheese

1/2 t salt

3/4 cup self raising flour

Pepper

Herbs and tomato slices



Grate the zucchini and onion. Place in a large mixing bowl with egg, cheese and salt. Mix with a fork

Add the flour and as much pepper as you like. Chop in any fresh herbs Pour the mixture into pre-buttered dish. Do not fill mix to top as mixture expands You can top the dish with, sliced tomatoes, more grated cheese, or parmesan cheese.

Bake at 200C for 25-40 mins until the mixture feels firm and top is browned slightly.

Leave to set at least 5 mins before cutting into pieces

#### BEETROOT

Beetroot is a much underrated vegetable as far as I am concerned; I love to roast them and serve them as a vegetable in their own right or preserve them for a later date

.Pickling beetroot couldn't be simpler. Take some fresh beetroot approx 1 kg, give them a wash and boil until tender, about twenty minutes or so. I keep checking them with a knife because I want them to retain some texture but it's up to you. Once cooked remove from the water and leave to cool slightly. The skins will peel away quite easily. Chop beetroot and pack snuggly into sterile jars.

Whilst all of this is going on get a saucepan and with 1 cup white vinegar, 1/2 cup water, and ½ cup sugar and ½ tsp salt to the boil, dissolving the sugar. Fill jars with the brine and place 1 tsp cumin seeds and ¼ tsp whole cloves into a cup and sprinkle them evenly into top of jars and seal.

#### IN YOUR GARDEN

Thirsty Work! This is the time of the year when many of your vegetable crops are nearing maturity. Putting in some extra effort now can help to achieve bumper crops. If you are growing cucumbers or courgettes, remember to keep giving them plenty of water. Make a shallow hollow around the stems of each plant and fill with compost. Constant watering of this area will keep the roots well supplied with moisture. A liquid feed every 10 days will encourage strong growth. To keep your beans cropping, ensure that they too, never go short of water. A really good drenching once a week and liquid feed every 10 days around the roots or sprayed over the leaves is especially beneficial. Once your



outdoor tomato plants have produced 4 trusses, nip out the growing points. The plants will then put all their energy into the swelling and ripening of the fruits on these trusses. Celery also benefits from feeding and frequent watering at this time of the year. A good tip is to wrap newspaper round each of the celery stalks and tie loosely in place, then earth up in easy stages, drawing up a little soil at a time over the next 6 to 8 weeks. Continue until only the tufts of leaves at the top of the celery plants are left exposed.



Late blight spells death for tomatoes and potatoes. Blight is a fungal disease that spreads rapidly in hot, humid conditions. Telltale symptoms include brown, shriveled foliage, blackened stems and ruined fruit, tomatoes rot on the vine, while potatoes turn to mush in the soil. Minor cases can be treated by pruning off the damaged foliage and spraying with copper or sprinkling with tomato dust. Once blight takes hold in late summer, it's best to cut your losses and get rid of the infected plants

before they spread their spores through your vegle plot. Don't compost any blight-stricken plants, bundle them into plastic garbage bags and get rid of them.

Brassicas take up to 4 months to mature, so get them in now for autumn and winter. Sow or plant Cabbage, Cauliflowers, Broccoli and Silverbeet, also sow Carrots and Parsnip for those winter vegetable soups.


Rooting Hormone: Take a willow branch, thickness of a pencil, and cut into 1" pieces, enough to cover the bottom of a bucket. Cover with water and leave 24hrs. Dip cuttings in solution. Difficult cuttings, leave in solution overnight then dip in manuka honey.

# It's official – Herbs and other Nutrients are almost infinitely safer than pharmaceutical medicines.

This graph compares the risks of dying from doing things like taking a Natural Health Product (NHP), consuming food, travelling in a car, taking pharmaceutical medicines, and going to hospital. The size of the sphere shows the level of risk. As you can see, the risk of dying from taking a NHP is so small that even if this risk was represented by printing the smallest dot possible, that dot would exaggerate the actual risk. So a circle around an invisible dot is used to represent this risk (bottom left hand comer of the graph). We can see that the risk of drying from taking a properly prescribed pharmaceutical medicine is roughly 3 times greater than travelling on the road, and almost infinitely greater than taking a NHP.

When we take a Natural Health Product (NHP) we are consuming substances that help to support the body and are also in harmony with it. Another term for NHP's is 'Dietary Supplements', which confirms the principal that their ingredients can also be found in food, and while foods are very safe, NHP's / dietary supplements are even safer.

#### "Most pharmaceutical medicines work by poisoning enzymes"

Those were the words of Dr Joe Pizzorno, ND, a world renowned spokesman for science based Natural Medicine who spoke in Auckland recently (<a href="https://www.droizzorno.com">www.droizzorno.com</a>).

He then gave an example: Cholesterol lowering Stafin drugs work by poisoning with enzyme which triggers the chemical reaction that produces cholesterol. This enzyme is also responsible for producing testosterone, and Stafins also poison the Co Enzyme, 'CoQ10'. The unintended drop in testosterone and CoQ10 levels are some of the unintended adverse effects (AE's) of Stafin drugs, which the industry calls side effects. The most widely reported AE of Stafins is muscle pain, which can lead to kidney failure. Other acknowledged AE's are cognitive loss (mood and memory problems), neuropathy (degeneration of the nervous system), pancreatic and hepatic (liver) dysfunction, and sexual dysfunction.

He went on to say that in the USA for every \$ spent on a drug, another \$1.82 is spent on countering its adverse effects. This leads to a cycle of ever increasing drug consumption and a corresponding increased risk of toxic overload. Dr Pizzorno also pointed out that the healthier your liver is, the less effective your drugs will be. Drugs get de-toxified in the liver, and as soon as the liver has completed that task, the drug is no longer toxic and stops working.

#### Changing New Zealand Road Rules: <u>Give-way</u> 5am on Sunday 25th March 2012

The changes to the give-way rules come into effect at 5am on Sunday 25 March 2012. Until then the current give-way rules apply. These changes will affect all drivers, riders, pedestrians and cyclists in New Zealand.

Are all the give-way rules at intersections changing?

No. Traffic signs and signals are placed at intersections to show road users what they need to do and this will not change. Road users should continue to obey all road signs and signals. Here is a snapshot of the current give way rules:

- If you are at an intersection controlled by a Stop sign, you must stop and give way to all other vehicles.
- If you are at an intersection controlled by a Give Way sign, you must give way to all other vehicles except those controlled by a Stop sign.
- If you are turning, give way to all vehicles not turning. Note: If the road is marked with a
  centre line, you are deemed to be turning if you leave the path of the centre line. If you follow
  the path of the centre line, you are deemed to be not turning.
- If you are turning left, give way to vehicles coming towards you that are turning right.
   (NOTE: THIS IS ONE OF THE RULES THAT WILL CHANGE)
- If the rules above do not determine who gives way, give way to vehicles coming from your right.

#### What give-way rules will be changing at 5am on 25 March 2012?

There are two give-way rules that will be changing.


#### Change 1: The left-turn versus right-turn rule

From 5am on 25 March 2012, this new rule will require all traffic turning right to give way to a vehicle coming from the opposite direction and turning left. This only applies at cross roads, T-intersections and driveways where:


- a) both vehicles are facing each other with no signs or signals (neither vehicle is controlled)
- b) both vehicles are facing give way signs
- c) both vehicles are facing stop signs
- d) both vehicles are facing green traffic signals

An example of each situation where the new rule will apply is shown below. In each of the diagrams below the RED car has to give way to the GREEN car:







# Change 2: At uncontrolled T-intersections ('uncontrolled' means when there are no signs or signals to tell you what to do)

At an uncontrolled T-intersection, all traffic from a terminating road (bottom of the T) will have to give way to all traffic on a continuing road (top of the T). This will bring it into line with T-intersections where there are Stop or Give Way signs on the terminating road. In the diagram below the RED car has to give way to the GREEN car:



Vehicle turning right from terminating road has to give way

This rule change will also apply to uncontrolled driveways, such as at a supermarket or hospital. From 5am on 25 March 2012 the traffic exiting the driveway will need to give way to all traffic on the road. All vehicles entering or exiting a driveway must continue to give way to pedestrians on a footpath, or cyclists and pedestrians on a cycle path or shared path. Drivers should not pull out to block the footpath in front of pedestrians and cyclists.

## Will there be any changes to the give-way rules at roundabouts?

No. You should continue to give way to vehicles on the roundabout coming from your right.

#### Public awareness campaign

It's important that you stick to the current rules until 5am on Sunday 25 March 2012.


An intensive public information campaign is being developed. The campaign will be run in the month leading up to the date of the change on 25 March 2012, with national advertising starting 10 days before the change. This late February start date is necessary to avoid public confusion and minimise the risk of people starting to use the new rules too early.

#### Facial Eczema

Spore counts are beginning to rise fast and it is time to protect your stock from the ravages of Facial Eczema. Milking herds should now be receiving zinc prevention at the full dose rates. Young stock need to be treated with zinc capsules because treating water troughs with zinc does not fully protect caives and sheep, as they don't drink enough water for the zinc to reach therapeutic levels. If you would like to be kept updated with actual spore counts, leave your email address at the clinic and we'll send you the reports from the local lab every Friday afternoon. We also offer in clinic spore counting.



Sample procedure:

\*Select a paddock.

\*Cut a handful of grass with scissors or knife at least 1cm above ground level

\*Repeat procedure about 10 times from random areas at least 10 metres apart around paddock.

\*Avoid parts of the paddock sheltered by trees/hedges and don't contaminate sample with soil and roots.

\*Collect sample in a clean plastic or paper bag, we need about 100g (one bread bag full).

\*If spore counting is not being done immediately, store in fridge.

The cost for this service is \$15.00 per sample and providing we are not too busy you will have results within 30minutes. So if you have any suspect paddocks you can get them tested before you graze them.

Sheltered north facing paddocks tend to have the highest spore



This is caused by toxins produced by a fungus living inside the plant. The toxin is found in the seed heads and the upper leaf as well as at the base of the plant in the leaf sheaths. As the summer goes on (especially if it is dry) the toxin levels rise.

Topping pastures can reduce the intake of toxins but the resultant dead litter is good food for the Facial eczema fungus. Feeding out 'Ryegrass toxin-free' feeds such as maize silage or grass silage dilutes the affects of the toxin. Though there are many remedies which claim they are effective against the toxin we haven't found any that work. If it is possible, removing affected animals to non-toxic pasture is the best treatment. Make sure they have plenty of water and shade if possible and provided they are not too severely affected they should improve in 4-5 days.

# **Farm Discussion Group Report**

As I was side tracked fishing down Waihou Bay we forgot to organise a discussion group for Feb so I thought I would let you all know my story and therefore my excuse for being so slack because I think it was worth it.

We left Morrinsvile at 5am knots tied and lines tested heading for Waihou Bay in search of Marlin. After a 5 hour journey we had the boat in the water and a 10 minute fizz out to the blue water and the lures were in the water, time to relax bobbing around the ocean, not so much as soon after we saw a free jumping marlin and headed to this area and soon after hooked into our first marlin for the trip. It caught us off guard a little bit as only been trolling for 20 min. We only had this fish on for 10 min it had some good jumping out the back of the boat and then 1 jump to many and the hook pulled. For the rest of this first day we looked around the area for the best water to be fishing in for the next few days and saw no more marlin.


The next morning all excited but with a bit more wind forecast we headed out and by 10:30 am hooked into another striped marlin, This was to be Mark Barker's first Marlin and after a large first run it soon tired out and was in the after 30 min without too much bother at the back of the boat. We decided to take this fish in to be weighed and smoked straight away so the fish stayed cool and in good quality.

We were off again by 12:30 and troiled a few more hours with it being my turn in the chair, At 2:50 another reel started to scream it was the back lure the fish jumped once to right, Blue marlin we yelled then we sped the boat as we started to clear the other rods but the fish was chasing the boat so we sped up some more and the fish went down and the line went very light so going about 20 knots at this stage thought to fish had got off but no it must have been close to the back of the boat and then eventually the pressure came back on the rod. By this time we had all the rods cleared going 20knots and the darn fish was still jumping about 30-40 meters out the back of the boat, this was an amazing display by a very large fish. The fish then went on a 500 metre run away from the boat and I got strapped into the rod for the battle to commence. We got the fish within 50 metres of the boat in 40 min and thought we were winning but each time the fish took more line and we circled the fish in a stalemate for 2 more hours before getting a chance to grab the leader. Andrew Morris (the skipper) grabbed the leader this is 2.5 hours into the fight and got the fish within 2 metres but could not lift it up so we could grab the bill but then the fish swam under the boat and Andrew had to let the fish go. This made the fish more angry and it jumped from 5 metres out the back of the boat for another 50 metres. We got the line back after 20 minutes and had the leader close to the boat then some more pressure came on the fish and the line parted. BUGGARI All the line landed in the boat when it broke and the 3 of us said some choice words and went home, by this time it was 6pm, 3 hours on a fish with no real reward except my best fishing story yet. We cried into our beer that night but celebrated Marks first marlin.

The next day we went out again this time with Andrew's wife Tammy on board and her time to play a marlin if we hooked up. And sure enough at 1:30 that day a reel went screaming off. This boat was hot. We didn't see this fish at all it took about 800metres of line out and we didn't know what it was yet. It took 10 min till we knew what we had on, Another Blue Marlin that was closer to another boat than ours. It was not an acrobatic fish like the last it stayed deeper and took 1.5 hours to get it close to boat and after a half hour battle in close we grabbed the leader then the bill and the gaff was firmly in to the fish. Well done tammy 2hours on the fish and we had it on board it was a 173 kg Blue Marlin.

The 1st day was a bit of trolling to no effect followed by a cray dive to feed the kids when we got home, so as you can hear the last thing on my mind was the farm discussion group. WE will be having one the second Tuesday of March. Also will be booking the annual fishing trip up the Coromandel for mid to late April maybe the 24<sup>th</sup> so keep this free.

Discussion Group

The next meeting of the Eureka Discussion Group is Tuesday March 13<sup>th</sup>. Venue is still to be confirmed. The usual reminder text will be sent to group members a week before hand with all necessary details.

#### Other Dates of Interest

The date for this year's **DairyNZ Farmers Forum** at Mystery Creek is 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> May. The conference is packed with top industry and research speakers and should be a "must do" in your dairy farming calendar.

The very popular Mark & Measure courses are again being run for farming couples to take time out to look at their business and future direction. The Taupo based courses are M&M Business Performance 15 & 16 May and M&M Strategic Planning 17 & 18 May. The courses are also repeated in June in Queenstown if you want a holiday break at the same time.

#### Yellow Bristle Grass

Yellow bristle grass is potentially a terrible pasture weed that many, if not most, Eureka farmers are unaware of. It is currently flowering and seeding in patches along arterial roads, railway lines and in some areas creeping into farmers paddocks."

Among other faults, yellow bristle grass is often unpalatable to stock after it has flowered. Like other summer active grasses, the feeding value of the plant is also low and pasture with a 25 percent infestation rate say, will cause a 11 percent drop in milk production over the January to April period. Cows tend to avoid grazing yellow bristle grass patches when in seed, so that the area affected is largely out of production until late autumn."

Learn to identify the weed. Keep it off the farm by keeping stock away from roadside infestations and remove small localised infestations if possible.

Yellow bristle grass is a sub-tropical annual. It germinates in early summer and grows rapidly in mid-summer, flowering and seeding in January. It is difficult to see until it produces a seed head, and by then its seed is probably viable and dropping on the ground for next season.

It tends to be particularly prevalent along roadsides, especially where roadside weed spraying has occurred in spring, allowing unimpeded growth by the yellow bristle grass. It can also germinate in bare ground on the edges of maize crops, with seed potentially transported to other areas by harvesting equipment.

Yellow bristle grass on roadsides remains there unless introduced onto the farm from animals grazing the long acre or by machinery. Once on the farm, it can become a serious problem due to dispersal via animal dung.

Yellow bristle grass can be controlled naturally by ensuring pastures are healthy and dense in spring to supress the germination of the seedlings. This is why yellow bristle grass has not done very well this year and is seeding later than usual, but did very well last season.

Spot spraying with glyphosate is useful for small areas of infestation but be aware that all other grasses will be killed also. A new selective herbicide looks promising and is being trialled on-farm by the yellow bristle grass committee in the Waikato.

The hot humid weather in the Walkato provides perfect conditions for flea population growth. Flea numbers can grow rapidly and can infest your house as well as your pet. Did you realise that 1 flea left untreated can produce 1.4 million eggs! Make sure that all the pets in the house are treated.

There are a number of products available that target the fleas specifically and are therefore safe to use on your young pet, e.g. Frontline Plus, Advantage, Advocate, Revolution, Comfortis. Your children will also be safe to handle the pets when they have this product applied.

#### Vaccination

These are very important to the long term health of your young pet. They provide immunity against a wide range of diseases that can be fatal in your pets, or leave them with on going medical issues after their infection. Parvo virus can be deadly in your puppy, but is easily preventable through vaccination.

Your puppy/kitten will get a new pet pack with their vaccines which has food and vouchers and lots of useful information within it.

#### Puppy Classes / Socialisation

It is important to introduce pupples to different breeds and environments to ensure that your dog turns into a sociable adult which is not scared of new situations.

The clinic runs puppy classes through out the year, please phone the clinic for more details.

#### Desexing

There are so many unwanted puppies and kittens that the SPCA have to deal with yearly. Desexing your pet is a sensible way to control the cat and dog population in this country. Generally this is done at 6months of age. For more information please contact the clinic.
