Guest editorials continued and are a feature of the Express enjoyed by all - thank you to those who contributed.



For those of you who don't know me, my name is Pieta Mace and I am Deidre's sister.

You may be aware of the awful illness of Motor Neurone Disease (MND) that has struck Deidre's husband, Fraser. Whilst we know that unfortunately there is no cure out there for MND, an opportunity has arisen for a treatment that may give Fraser more time to spend with his family.

Deidre and Fraser are heading to the US for Stem Cell treatment. Lots of questions and very few answers but if it buys Fraser more time then I am sure you will agree that the chance for him to extend his life up is totally worth it. The clinic say whilst no guarantees, of the 200 people with MND treated 90% have a slowdown in the progression, or in some cases a degree of reversal. The similar patient of best results is now better than he was six years ago upon treatment.

The treatment is perfectly scheduled between the North Island Rowing Champs and Maadi knowing that Deidre and Fraser wouldn't miss supporting, their son, Cameron at these events.

The cost, in excess of \$40,000 is a big burden for the family and if we could help I know that we would all feel a sense of pride in knowing that we helped to give Fraser some extra time in our world.

I know that many of you have already done a lot to help Deidre and Fraser in the way of wonderful meals, transporting the children to/from school and sporting events or even building chicken runs to name a few. Deidre and Fraser have been humbled by the generosity from friends, family and the community.

Motor Neurone Disease

Motor neurone disease is a neurological condition that causes the progressive degeneration of specialised nerve cells, called motor neurons, in the brain and spinal cord. It has no known cause and is invariably fatal, with a likely life expectancy of 2-4 years from diagnosis.

Motor neurone disease symptoms can include generalised muscle spasms, exaggerated reflexes and a progressive wasting and weakness of muscles responsible for speech, chewing and swallowing. As the condition progresses, sufferers may be unable to walk, speak, use their arms and hands, or hold up their head.

2 teaspoons baking powder


1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix together the 2 vinegars and sugar together until sugar dissolved then mix in the Heinz salad




Stir in the salad dressing with broccoli mixture. It shouldn't be dry but it shouldn't be to wet. Place in fridge.

CO Comment



What a great turnout of Eureka DG members and friends of Brendon van Vugt that turned out for the Drought Shout put on by The Breeze and Good George Brewery. It all came about because Brendon won the radio stations Drought Shout prize.

There must have been about 60 turn up, and apart from an attack of flies that also wanted to share in the sausages, the locally brewed beer and Cider from Good George Brewery was very well received. If you're on Facebook, then look up The Breeze to see a selection of photographs from the event.

Beat The Heat Meetings

In mid March DairyNZ ran a series of Beat the Heat farmer meetings with the one in Gordonton having the biggest turnout of 110 people.

The events rated well with participants as it got peoples focus on setting the farm up for next season through pasture cover and body condition score targets for June. Many of the messages were not new but farmers attending were reassured that what they had planned for their farm was generally on line with best practice.

We used an actual farm and its feed budget to look at options to fill a 300t feed deficit. Drying some or all of the herd off early (especially younger and lighter cows) was a major consideration along with OAD milking and purchasing some extra supplement if the quality and price is right.

Look Out For Your Young Stock

When asked to think back to key learnings from the 2008 drought many farmers stressed the importance of looking after young stock out grazing. Because the whole of the North Island is drought affected this time, there aren't the opportunities to find other grazing and new supplement purchasing options are also quite limiting. So check your young stock closely and consider something like PKE to fill the gap until pasture gets away again.

Hopefully it has rained by the time you are reading this. However the effects of the drought certainly won't have gone. Careful management over the next 6 months will be required to ensure it's effects are minimised for next season.

Good News

Two bits of good news are that 1) Black Beetle on most farms is not a big issue, this year, like it was in 2008. 2) Pastures will recover better than you think and certainly pasture growth will be better than expected due to warm soil conditions and unused fertility just waiting to be tapped.

Annual Fishing Trip

The annual fishing trip to the Coromandel is set for April 16th. This is a half day out on a barge where we tie up to a Mussel harvester. The fishing has always been very good and we come home with a limit of 9 snapper per person. A filleting session and BBQ in the afternoon ends a great day. But not quite as you get to take home some nice fresh snapper fillets!!

Asking to be excused for a bit to spray trees is something that I would never have to do previously, but I have learned that if the weather and conditions are right you have to do the task then, because the opportunity might pass you by.


We have come accustomed to the sounds of the dairy sheds around us. The tractors working the fields and moving feed around. These sounds are something that I will not trade for the noises of living in town.

Microchipping

Peace of mind if your pet goes missing

We are all aware of the need for our dogs to be microchipped for registration, with farm dogs being exempt. However, a number of our clients are now microchipping their cats as well.

Cats are known to be nosey and get into cars or garages, or wander off and can get lost etc. If your pedigree puss or all-round moggie goes missing then you can have peace of mind that when they are found, you can be re-united with them.

Dogs have to be registered with the local council. However, where we live there are 3 local councils (Hamilton City, Waikato Regional and Waipa) all close by and if your dog gets picked by a council that they are not registered at, you have to try to communicate

with all of them to find your dog. What happens if you have a cat microchipped? Who do you give their details to?





One easy solution is to join the Companion Animal Register which was formed by a number of animal welfare groups coming together, including NZVA, NZKC, SPCA and NZCF. The site is managed by the New Zealand Companion Animal Council and the profits go to fund New Zealand Animal Charities. For a small one off fee, approx \$15, your pet's details, whether cat, dog, bird or horse, will be uploaded for life and if they are found then they will contact you. The site is operational 24/7. Remember when you move, to update your details with the register so that if your pet goes missing, they can find you!

Microchipping is safe, quickly done and offers lifetime peace of mind for you and your pet, what ever species they might be.

Microchipping update:

Did you know that microchips can very occasionally malfunction and stop working, no-one knows why?

Pop down to the clinic and let one of the nurses check that your pet's microchip is working. We offer this service for free to give you peace of mind.




