#### **Guest Editorial**

There is the cliché travel broadens the mind. On reflection how true this is

On our recent OE to Chile there was many moments to reflect and compare Kiwis wellbeing with the Chilean people

Both economies are relatively open but coming from different perspectives. Chile's ruling party is socialist ours is capitalist, NZ social welfare and



regulatory environments hamper and marginalises our tier structures, increasingly making it more difficult to move from one tier to the next

Our recent experiences with subdividing land for housing where unnecessary costs are driving up the cost of housing by more than \$20000 per section with no great material benefit to the value for the house owner and I suspect this will be the same with the actual building as well. I wonder who actually benefits from the regulations that are imposed certainly not the new home owner

Then I look at the family structures and the benefits to society of retirement homes and look at the helpers who regularly work in this environment, and wonder what a large proportion of these employees futures are. Most have limited education and limited opportunities for advancement in their lives mostly driven by there different rates of maturity. Education or qualifications overlooks them and they are destined forever to be left in the lower wage jobs when there compassion and skills far out weights their inability to achieve in our present education system

Are we providing truly a better society or are we providing for our own individual greed by having a heavily regulated society

This gets me onto the efficiency trait that actually started me thinking about life in general. The subject that came up in my mind was Education ( don't get me wrong here I value Education I don't value the politics surrounding it). With Grand children now entering secondary status prompts me as well to further understand the real benefits

The point I am trying to make is that education is a life time subject not a short term fix to get your first time job. I recently have been involved in employing people for a number of position right through from juniors to directors of small business's . There is only one common denominator that is attitude that makes them successful, education in itself doesn't provide this. The common denominator with all these people is the accumulation of debt, when the majority of the education for most young people could be provided by an employer who along with our educationalists would continue to drive forward with a greater partnership.

The senseless regulations and costs which is diverting resources away from making this country an even greater place to live. Let's face it this is the greatest place on earth to live as long as we don't overburden society with meaningless regulation or expectations that will reduce us to mediocrity through not providing the innovators the freedom to explore their own minds and not be clouded in fear for failure that has been limited by some regulator authority who have no imagination.







## LADIES A PLATE

#### **Kiwifruit Muffins**

#### Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon ground allspice

1 egg

2 tablespoons butter, melted

1/2 cup raisins

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Dash salt

1/2 cup whole milk

2 kiwifruit, peeled and chopped

#### Method:

Combine dry ingredients.

2. In another bowl, beat the egg, milk, and butter. Stir into dry ingredients until just moistened. Fold in kiwifruit and raisins.

 Fill paper lined muffin tins <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> full. Bake at 425° F (200° C) for 15-19 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean from the middle.

Cook 5 minutes before removing from the pan to a wire rack. Serve Warm.
 Yield: 10 muffins

**Lemon Surprise Puddings** 

Ready in 1 hour, can serve 6 as one large pudding or 12 as smaller puddings, baked in ramekins.

#### Ingredients

100g butter, softened 2 lemons, freshly zested 4 large eggs, separated 500ml milk 2/3 cup caster sugar 3 lemons, juiced 1/2 cup plain flour Softly whipped cream

#### Method:

Place oven rack on second to bottom rung in the oven. Preheat to 180°C.

 Using mixer or handheld beater, cream butter with sugar until creamy, white and fluffy. Add lemon zest and juice – the mixture will probably curdle at this point, but don't worry. Beat in egg yolks, one at a time. Then gently beat in flour and milk. (Your mixture will be thin.)

3. In a clean bowl beat egg whites till they stand in snowy peaks, and then fold them

gently into the mixture.

 Pour mixture into 12 well-buttered ramekin dishes or one well-greased 2-litre baking dish. It should be about 6-7cm deep, so that the pudding can separate into a fluffy cake on top with the lemon sauce underneath.

5. Stand the pudding or puddings in a baking dish of cold water, ensuring that the

water comes halfway up the sides.

Bake for 20-25 minutes for the ramekins and 50-60 minutes for the large pudding.
The sponges will rise and lightly colour on top. If the pudding is browning too
much, cover the dish loosely with foil during the last ten minutes.

7. Serve pudding with softly whipped cream.

**Cook's tip:** The positioning of the rack is important to the success of this delicate soufflélike dessert. If you place the rack too high, the pudding will colour too quickly, before cooking has finished, so opt for the lower position and enjoy these puddings as soon as they come out of the oven



### IN YOUR GARDEN

Hi Folks.

What a few weeks it's been! Heavy frosts, several one after the other, and some -4 degrees!


Small lifestyle block owners should fence off new grazing the day before when a frost is expected the next morning. The reason for this is if you drive a bike or vehicle over frosted ground, the tracks you leave will cause damage which will result in dead grass. Leave feeding out until the afternoon if possible.



Pruning of roses, fruit trees and hedging should be done now. For fruit trees that haven't been pruned for a few years remove centre branches by nearly half their length and trim back side branches. Hard pruning may affect fruiting the following year but at least you have control over your trees. Good crops will follow if you cut back every year. When driving in the country note how hard orchardists prune their trees.

For roses, prune about half their length, keeping an even height over top of plant. Prune standards and bush the same. For climbers remove old wood, leave straight new- year shoots, these can be tied to the fence later in the year.

#### THE CARE OF ROSES

PLANTING

Dig a hole a little deeper than the container and twice as wide, the bud union should be slightly above ground level.

DO NOT PUT FERTILIZER IN THE BOTTOM OF THE HOLE, only well-rotted compost. TRY TO AVOID TEASING THE ROOTS, place the rose straight into the hole.

Water well, fill in hole and tread firmly around the plant.

Plant bush roses not less than 80 cm apart and for standards not less than 100 cm apart.

Roses need an open, sunny position, protected from winds. They can tolerate a few hours of shade.

PRUNING

If you are buying your new roses in winter they will still need pruning as well as any established ones you may have. Prune just before the spring growth commences, in most areas around mid-July. Prune your new rose preferably to an outward bud.

EXISTING ROSES

In all roses you must completely remove all old wood and spindly growth. All dieback must be removed to a clean healthy bud. Treat standard the same as bush roses. Climbers are pruned in a similar manner except that the younger strong shoots are not shortened back, but are attached to the fence to spread out as evenly as possible. Old growth and unwanted branches should be removed.

Use pruning paint on bigger cuts.

SPRAYING.

Apply a winter spray 1 week after pruning using - EITHER Lime Sulphur OR White oil plus Copper Oxychloride.

Spray regularly with a recommended spray for insecticides and fungicides.

Alternate your spray programme.

Use protective clothing when spraying

Always read the instructions carefully and carry out all safety recommendations.

PREVENTION IS BETTER THAN CURE.

FEEDING

During spring cover the surface of your rose bed with well-rotted organic material, including weed free mushroom compost. Apply a balanced rose fertiliser in September, November and January. Always follow the instructions on fertiliser bag.

Careful pruning, watering and most importantly feeding every 3months from July till approximately Christmas to encourage a healthy rose.



### Herd testing device unveiled.

(Published in 'Cambridge Edition 22 June 2015)

CRV Ambreed demonstrated a new industry-leading herd testing device at this year's New Zealand National Agricultural Fieldays.

The device was developed as part of the company's ongoing focus on creating better efficiencies for New Zealand dairy farmers, especially during a challenging season.

Patsy Booth, herd testing manager at CRV Ambreed, said the new device would get milk production data to farmers more quickly, which was a "great step in the right direction for enhancing and improving CRV Ambreed's herd testing service".

CRV Ambreed employees 25 – 30 trained herd testing technicians across New Zealand who service around 700 customers. Each technician will be armed with one of the devices, which is used to capture volume and production information at the shed.

Providing the farmer's records are up to date, the technician will be able to send through a full herd testing report to the customer on the spot.

"This not only improves the accuracy and integrity of the data we capture, but it also allows CRV Ambreed to shift over 1000 hours spent each year on back-office data entry into other services that benefit our customers," Booth said.

Sharemilkers, farmers and breeders use herd testing information to make breeding decisions and choices to improve the performance of their cows.

The data are also crucial for CRV Ambreed's breeding programme to produce long-lasting, productive animals.

"Herd testing has a massive impact on how our customers can improve their herds. Using better technology allows CRV Ambreed to provide a higher quality, more efficient service."

## RECYLE AND REFUSE COLLECTION GUIDELINES



- Put your refuse bags and recycle bin out by 7:30am
- There is no collection on a statutory holiday. Your collection will be one day late.

#### Refuse Collection Guidelines

- We only collect two plastic bags from each house
  - These are the black bags available from supermarkets
- We don't collect from wheelie or rubbish bins
- We don't collect multi wall paper bags
- We don't collect bags weighing more than 20kg

#### Recycle Collection Guidelines

IMPORTANT: The only bin that will be emptied is the green bin supplied by the Council. Bottles in cardboard boxes left beside the bin will not be collected for safety reasons.

Please empty bottles from beer boxes in to the green bin.

#### IN the recycle bin

- Glass bottles, jars (no window glass, broken glass or light bulbs)
- Plastic, household containers, types 1, 2 and 5 only
  - Please rinse and squash containers put lids in refuse
- Aluminum and steel cans, empty aerosol cans, foil plates
  - Please rinse and squash containers

#### BESIDE the recycle bin

- Put papers in to supermarket bags with the handles tied and placed beside your bin.
- · Cardboard boxes must be flattened, tied in a bundle not exceeding 500mm wide, and be positioned beside your bin.

### Frequently Asked Questions About Recycling

#### Need another bin?

Additional bins can be purchased from Council's Ngaruawahia office

#### Can I put paper and cardboard in the green bin?

Paper and thin card should be placed in a supermarket bag with handles tied, and placed on top of your bin. Larger cardboard should be securely bundled and placed beside the green bin

#### Why do I need to rinse containers?

Rinsing helps recycling by reducing contamination and food leftovers can attract flies or animals and spread disease. A cold water rinse is usually enough.

#### Why should I squash containers?

Flattened cans and plastic bottles are less likely to blow around in the wind and cause litter. Unsquashed items also take up a lot of space in both your bin and the collection truck.

#### Why remove lids?

- Lids are usually made from different plastic or metal and so they may not be able to be recycled along with the container. Taking lids off also helps when processing the collected containers by ensuring the container is empty and makes processing safer.

#### What if my recycling does not get collected?

Non-complying materials will be left in the container with a sticker explaining the reason for noncollection. If you believe that the collection has missed your property phone Council 0800 492 452.


School bus signs

The signs below will be displayed on school buses. If a school bus has stopped you must slow down and drive at 20km/h or less until you are well past (no matter which direction you are coming from) if:

· the bus displays a school bus sign on which the lights are flashing, or

 the bus displays a school bus sign (with or without flashing lights) and has stopped for the purpose of picking up or dropping off school children.







Note: you may also see 'Kura', the Māori word for school, on a bus.

Police will strictly enforce a 4km/h tolerance of the posted speed limit outside schools, kindergartens and play centres during high-use times. This will apply within 250 metres of the boundaries on each side of the school.

#### School zones

Some schools display signs that are turned on before and after school and other times such as lunchtime:



This sign will be displayed at the start of the school zone. If the 40 is visible and the yellow lights are flashing, the maximum speed is 40km/h until the zone ends.
