On Friday the 13th July 2007 (Oh boy, don't I know it) I had a motor vehicle accident, and broke every bone in my body. An example of the Eureka community spirit was demonstrated on that day. My husband was working in his shed and a car stopped at the gate and an unknown lady, informed him that I had, had an accident and that she had recognised my car. The lady didn't leave her name, but thank you very much, whoever you may be.

Long story short, on the 28th November 2016, I had to undergo a below knee AMPUTATION......the dreaded word......or perhaps the word that we are looking for is DISABILITY/DISABLED!

As a disabled person, my life didn't end on that day in November, it just continued, just like everyone else, I just have to do things in a slightly different way, or if I was to be poetic, I would say that I started a new chapter in my life.

Unfortunately human natures being what it is people tend to jump to conclusions, which may not necessarily be true. Like I can't walk up stairs, or I can only walk in a straight line and are unable to walk around something...both regrettably false.

Sometimes I attend church with my husband and it continues to amuse me how many people find my prosthesis so very uncomfortable, and in reality cannot coordinate the prosthesis or disability with the rest of me. My favourite was when, after the service I stood up to get up a cup of tea, and before I could blink, I had that cup of tea in my hand.

Please don't think that I didn't appreciate the gesture, I sincerely did. I realise that people want to help and I sincerely appreciate the sentiment.


So how about, we refer to disabilities, as challenges - more to the positive I say!

EUREKA EXPRESS AGM REPORT

The 37th Annual General Meeting of the Eureka Express was held on 15 March 2017 at the Eureka Hall. Ten residents attended the meeting which was chaired by Editor Gail Mayall.

Income for the 2016 financial year was \$3,301.10; Cash expenditure \$1963,61 - a profit before depreciation of \$1,337.49. Bank balances at the end of the financial year were - Encore account \$4,315.87; Bonus Saver account \$11,010.25. Advertising charges will remain the same. Funds have been earmarked for an AED unit and chairs for Eureka Hall.

Editor, Gail, outlined the events organized by the Eureka Express team in 2016 including the Annual Easter colouring competition – 36 entries were received. She made mention of Jack & Linda Hooper who moved from the district in December, both of whom were contributors to, and supporters of, the Express. Gail also noted the loss of helper and supporter, Cheryl McFarlane who passed away early in 2017.

TASTE BUDS

PICCALILI

1/2 large cauliflower, cut into small florets

2 bulbs fennel, cut into small chunks

350g green beans, chopped into short lengths

I red onion, roughly chopped

2 tablespoons mustard oil

2 tablespoons ground cumin and turmeric

2 tablespoons English mustard powder

500 ml white wine vinegar

2 mongos, peeled, stoned and roughly chopped

3 cloves garlic, crushed

sliced

I head broccoli, cut into small florets

4 red chillies. 2 green chillies, seeds still in, finely

300g shallots, cut into eighths

2 handfuls fine sea salt

2 heaped tablespoon mustard seeds

1 nutmeg, grated

4 tablespoons flour

2 apples, grated

6 tablespoons sugar

2 tablespoons dried oregano

4 bay leaves

- 1. Put all the vegetables in a bowl, add the salt and enough water to cover. Leave in a cool place for about 1 hour.
- 2. Heat a saucepan big enough to hold all the vegetables. Add the mustard oil to the pan, then fry the mustard seeds, cumin, turmeric and nutmeg for a moment. Lower the heat, add the mustard powder, flower and a splash of vinegar. Stir well to make a thick paste. Gradually add the remaining vinegar and 100ml water, stirring all the time to make a smooth paste. Add the apples, mangos, sugar, garlic, oregano and bay leaves. Cook for 2-3 minutes.
- 3. Drain the salted vegetables and add them to the pan, stirring well to coat with the spicy paste. Cook for 10-15 minutes until the vegetables have just softened and started to release some juice.
- 4. Spoon into sterilized jars and close the lids tightly. Leave for a good couple of months to mature.

TOMATO SAUCE

(Approx. 150 years old, thank you Gran Fever for your legacy)

8 lbs tomatoes

2 lb apples

6 large onions

1/4 lb salt

2 lb brown sugar

1/4 Ib whole allspice

1tsp cayenne pepper

1 oz cloves

1 quart vinegar

Cut up the onions, apples and tomatoes. Put all ingredients into a preserving pan and boil gently for 3 hours, stirring occasionally. Cool and blend with a whizz.

Bottle and let it mature for a month. Enjoy!

IN YOUR GARDEN

Well what a summer we have had. People were saying their tomatoes and other vegetables were slow to get going this spring. It was due to colder nights then normal for spring evenings. My tomato crop, over 800 plants, were a month later then other years which is very frustrating as we could be heading to an early winter.

Things in the garden, if you're planning to buy plants, plan were you're going to plant, what type of plant or tree etc. Prepare ground by spraying off weeds if you can when weeds are yellowing turn soil over burying as deep as possible same for a vegetable gardens although most people prefer to have raised vegetable gardens. When building a raised garden remember that most vegetable plants only need about 15cm of good compost. e.g. mushroom compost. Put at bottom of raised garden rocks, old soil etc, leaving about 15cm from the top for compost.

If planting roses, fruit trees, hedge plants, trees etc check with your nursery or garden centre for available times they will be ready and order your requirements so as not to miss out.

Start spraying roses etc with a cooper spray to slow plant growth to help plants go dormant in the winter and ready for growth and flower in the spring. If roses flower profusely through a warm winter they will have a poor flush of growth and flower in spring. Prune roses, fruit trees about July. Hedging any time throughout the year. Don't prune if trees are fruiting or in flower. When pruning in July put a hand full of fert around the drip line of the rose or fruit tree.

Planting when purchasing plants. Most are in pots, select good shaped plants. Dig hole bigger then size of pot and put a generous amount of mushroom compost into the hole, don't put man made fert in hole as this could burn new root as they start growing. Cut bag off or take pots off – DO NOT disturb roots; if some roots are root bound cut with a sharp knife downwards 4 or 5 cuts around pot, still not touching roots.

If you want weed free no bark compost we have mushroom compost available in bulk or bagged, use your trailer for buckets lots or we can deliver on our small truck

Get your Cat De-sexed now!

If you think you have a reason for letting your pet breed, we say it's time to reconsider!!

Cats are breeding at a greater rate than ever – faster than good homes can be found.

They become unwanted, are given away, stray, or are callously dumped. They suffer out of sight of their owners. The lucky ones end up in animal shelters where they are placed in new homes. Keeping a pet is a lifetime commitment and the one-time expense of de-sexing will bring many advantages to both animal and owner.

Advantages of De-sexing

No de-sexed dog or cat can ever get cancer or other diseases of the reproductive organs, such as testicular tumours, cystic ovaries, ovarian tumours or acute or chronic uterine infections. De-sexed animals are also at far less risk of mammary cancer, prostate diseases, tumours and hernias. There will never be a risk of pregnancy complications. Because neutered animals avoid these medical problems they tend to live longer, healthier lives. A de-sexed animal is often a more relaxed pet. Neutering reduces a pets desire to roam and fight. De-sexing decreases embarrassing behaviour habits like leg mounting and spraying. It also eliminates the frantic pacing and crying of a cat in heat. De-sexing your pet saves you a lot of money. A pregnant animal requires additional food, as will the kittens. "Entire" animals are more likely to roam in search of a mate thereby being at greater risk of being severely injured after being hit be a car. De-sexing fees for your animal are very reasonable and veterinarians are already keeping costs to a minimum to encourage people to have their animals de-sexed.

De-sexing myths:

It is important that people understand that de-sexing does not change the personality of their pet, or, make it fat and lazy!

There is absolutely no truth to the myth that it is best to let a female cat give birth to a litter before getting her spayed. In reality it is better for a cat to be spayed before she comes into heat.

Responsible pet ownership means getting your cat de-sexed as soon as possible. We recommend any time after the age of 5 months.

But whether a pet owner neglects to have a cat de-sexed because they want her to have "just one litter" first, or whether someone simply did not want to spend the money for their pet's surgery, the end result is the same: far too many animals for the number of available homes. And that's why April is.......Spay + Neuter Month!



NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR



Last year Council called for submissions on the proposed Easter Trading Policy 2017. 1268 submissions were received and 51% were in favour of shops being able to open on Easter Sunday in Waikato district. The Policy and Regulatory Committee has recommended that the Policy be adopted at next month's full Council meeting. In line with the feedback I received from residents in Eureka Ward, I voted against the policy being adopted. It was passed with four Councillors in support and four opposed...

The Policy ensures that individual business owners can make their own choice whether to open or not. You can read the draft policy online at www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz

Over the next 15 months Council will prepare its **Draft Long Term Plan (LTP) 2018-28**. We attended a workshop last week to commence discussions about the long term strategic direction for the district. Our communities will be invited to have their say in the next few months. A Long Term Plan is a financial and community planning document that we must produce every three years and sets the direction Council is heading by establishing agreed community outcomes and goals. The LTP will be finalised and adopted in June 2018.

Unfortunately I was unable to attend the lauch of the AED at Eureka Hall on 19th March. However I understand quite a number of residents attended and were given instruction on how to use the machine and were able to practice their CPR skills. I will be encouraging other communities to install a unit in their district. Congratulations to the Eureka Express and Eureka Hall Committees for investing in this project that could save lives.

We have held an Extraordinary Council meeting this week to approve the Annual Plan 2017/2018 Consultation Document and proposed amendments to fees and charges. This plan will now be put out for submissions which will be heard in late May. I will give more details in my next newsletter.

Despite the heavy rainfall during March, until further notice there is still a **restricted fire season** for Waikato District. You therefore require a permit to light any fire in the open air. There is no charge for a fire permit which can be applied for on line or through Council during business hours – 8am – 5pm Monday to Friday.

Remember you are responsible for any fire you light and will be held accountable for the costs if the fire gets out of control and causes damage. Under the Forest & Rural Fires Act 1977 firefighting costs from \$1,000 - \$250,000 will be recovered from the person responsible for lighting the fire. If you have any questions about fire permits or fire season status phone WDC on 0800 492 452.

This week Councillors visited Hamilton Expressway sites to be given an update on progress. Our site visits included the Southern Interchange at Tamahere, Matangi Road Bridge, Morrinsville Road Bridge/Ruakura Interchange, East Coast Main Truck Rail Bridge, Martins Lane, Horsham Downs and Resolution Interchange/Horsham Downs link. We also visited the Project Visitor Centre at the contractors headquarters near Ruakura and received an ecology briefing and viewed the aerial flythrough video.

The Huntly section of the Expressway is progressing well despite the recent wet weather. So far 1.2 million cubic metres of material has been shifted. There are over 150 different items of machinery on site (including diggers weighing 185 tonnes) and so far 800,000 man hours have been worked. Photos of the various sites can be seen on the NZTA website. A public open day, with photos, maps and other information about the Huntly section on display, will be held on Thursday 18th May at the Riverside Room, Huntly Civic Centre between 2pm and 7pm.
