Attend a community Blueprint workshop to have your say

After a successful first round of Blueprint workshops, Waikato District Council is visiting more towns in the district to hear further from its community.

Waikato District Council General Manager Community Growth Clive Morgan says the first round of workshops in the north of the Waikato district had nearly 200 in attendance. "It was fantastic to see so many from our communities come to a workshop to tell us what they see their towns being like in the future.

"We need to hear from a large cross section of the community so we can ensure our community's aspirations are included in Council's key strategic and planning documents going forward. I encourage everyone to come along to these workshops. Invite your friends and neighbours along and make sure your views are heard," Mr Morgan says.

But what is a Blueprint?

"A Blueprint will show the desired future for the district and a Local Area Blueprint will be focused at a town, village or rural area level. A Blueprint will address growth, infrastructure, social, community, environmental, economic and transport issues. At a local level these are more detailed and specific to the place," Mr Morgan says.


The first round of community workshops were held in the north of the district in early August. Council wants you to attend the second round of workshops so that you can share your future wants and needs for your community. Your thoughts on what you want your town to be are vital, so if you want to see more parks, police or other social services for example, then you need to come along to the public workshops and tell us.

The workshops are run as practical sessions where small groups will brainstorm ideas and come up with possible solutions and ideas.




Our next task is under way that is sourcing replacement hand dryers. Hopefully these will be installed by the end of the year.

Russell will be sadly missed by them all.



And we were saddened to learn of the recent deaths of **Dr Chris Freke and Margaret Woolford.**



You can keep up to date with what we are up to via our Facebook page as this is updated weekly with proposed activities or outings.





TASTE BUDS

COCONUT AND LIME CAKE

1 1/2 cups (225g) self-rising flour 1/2 cup (40g) desiccated coconut 2 teaspoons lime rind finely grated 1 cup (220g) caster sugar 125g butter, melted 2 Eggs 1 cup (250ml) coconut milk Lime drizzle icing
1 1/2 cups (240g) icing sugar mixture
2 tablespoons lime juice

Method

Preheat oven to 180C. Grease and line the base and 2 long sides of a 10cm x 22cm (base measurement) loaf pan with baking paper.

Combine flour, coconut, lime rind and sugar in a large bowl. Whisk butter, eggs and coconut milk in a small bowl. Add to the flour mixture. Stir to combine. Pour into prepared pan. Smooth the surface. Bake for 45 mins or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Set aside in the pan for 5 mins. Turn onto a wire rack to cool completely.

To make the lime drizzle icing, place the icing sugar in a bowl. Add enough lime juice to form a runny paste. Pour over the top of the cooled cake.


POTATO PISSALADIERE (from France)

2 tbs butter570 grams kumera and potato mixed1 egg, lightly beaten2 tbs grated parmesan cheeseSalt and pepper to taste

2 tbs sundried tomato paste
2 tbs tomato paste
3 tomatoes thinly sliced
2tbs chopped basil
60 grams both mozzarella and cheddar
60 grams anchovy fillets sliced lengthwise
Some black olives to dress

Method

Chop potatoes and kumera, boil and when cooked drain very well. Mash and add butter, egg, parmesan, salt and pepper. Spread onto a tray in an 8x11inch shape and bake 20 mins. Mix together tomato pastes and spread over potato base. Arrange tomato slices on top, sprinkle with basil and mozzarella and cheddar cheeses. Arrange anchovies in a lattice pattern on top. Slice olives and arrange them on the anchovies. Sprinkle with some basil to dress and bake 10 mins till chees is melted.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Well, spring is here. Plant anything you are considering to plant now. E.g.: potatoes, roses, fruit trees, hedge plants, vegetables for the summer and citrus, the list goes on.


A good reason to get planting is a possible dry spell due to hit us in November or December. By then it is too late to think about planting.

Let's talk about Citrus, their benefits and needs in terms of how they grow and the best ways to look after a citrus tree. Most citrus's are grafted on trifoliate stock, some grown by cutting mainly Meyer lemons which do well in a large container and fruits within 2 years of planting.

There are 3 most popular lemons:

- Meyer is thin skinned and mild.
- Eureka and Lisbon Thick skinned and quite tart in taste, suitable for marmalade.

Several varieties of mandarins are also suitable for large pots. Also are easy peel and seedless. Good for kids lunches. Satsuma is superseded by several other new types of mandarins.



New Zealand Grapefruit, most popular with several new varieties and some not so new.

Limes, Tahitian are the most popular which has green fruit. There is also Rangpur which is another Lime variety that is orange with the same flavour as the Tahitian. Kaffir Lime is grown for its aromatic leaves which are used for cooking. Its fruit is only ornamental. Most citrus trees brought at garden centres and nurseries have lots of new growth when you purchase. The reason for this is the plants are mostly under plastic canopies. When planting the above trees, do not tease the roots.


At Roach's we keep our citrus in the open all winter, this makes the tree hardy and will transplant easily. The tree will not require frost protection the following winter.


Please note, the most susceptible to frost is Limes when the tree is small.

At Roach's we have over 1 hundred trees to choose from, Retailing for only \$25.00 each. Some are over 1 metre and bushy. We also stock Roses, Fruit trees including Louisa plums, citrus, hedge plants and have a large range of vegetable seedlings. Poplar trees to plant out now, only \$1.50 each.

How to keep your privacy online

There's multiple ways you can lose your privacy online – through your operating system, through your web browser, your search engine, your email provider, through pirated software and malware, or your phone. Let's look at each of those in turn.

By default, Windows 10 sends a lot of data about your web browsing, computer usage, even keystrokes and voice, back to Microsoft headquarters. Of course, they say they're not doing anything with it other than improving their product, but you don't really know who to trust after the "5-eyes" scandal showed Microsoft, Google and many other companies were sharing sensitive data with the CIA.

The best way to avoid all that is to run Linux instead, but pragmatically most of us can't do that for reasons ranging from technical difficulty through to needing to use Windows-only programs or hardware. The 2nd-best way is to download a free program called 'O&O ShutUp10' and apply the "recommended settings". This will turn off the bulk of Microsoft's spying and "phoning home".

Your web browser does similar things, and again it depends how much you trust Google (who makes Chrome) or Microsoft (who makes Edge and Internet Explorer) as to how that makes you feel. One solution is to use Firefox, which is more robust than Chrome/Internet Explorer/Edge and is developed by a non-profit (Mozilla) with internet security and privacy as it's core goals.

Your search engine also tracks your searches, if you're using any of the main ones like Google or Bing. But DuckDuckGo, a silly-named-but-fully-functional search engine, is one which doesn't, and it has a similar interface. Of course if you're using a free email service like Gmail, Yahoo or Outlook, those will scan your emails and send (supposedly) anonymous data back to their parent companies. You can instead pay for a private email address from services such as ProtonMail, or use the email address from your internet service provider.

Using pirated software or being infected by malware can also cause your computer to transmit data to third parties. Even some non-pirated 'free software' online can contain "PUA"s or "Potentially-Unwanted-Programs", which can harvest user data and send it through to analytical firms. These are malware, though not as malicious as the viruses which tend to piggyback on pirated software.


If you're using pirated software, the best solution is to stop doing so; there are plenty of legitimately-free open-source variants of different types of software out there, from office suites (Libreoffice) through to 3D-modelling (Blender). It's not worth getting a virus just to get something you're more familiar with. If you suspect you may have some "PUA"s or other malware in your system, getting a decent antivirus program such as Eset Internet Security can sort those out.

None of the above covers how your phone tracks your movements and reports them back to Google/Apple! That's even scarier. The simplest way to avoid this to turn off "location" awareness on your phone unless you need it (eg. for google maps and the like). I haven't gone into the likes of Facebook, Twitter etc because essentially you sign away your rights to whatever you put online when you sign up. There're a few things you can do to increase your privacy with third parties and strangers (do a web search for "increase facebook privacy", for example), but you can't hide the data from the companies themselves.

There's a price we pay for a lot of these free things online, and it's not always obvious what that is. A lot of the time we just have to trust that nothing too bad will come of it – but sometimes, it's worth thinking, do I really want Mark Zuckerberg knowing what I wrote to my nephew on Christmas day? Best of luck all- and if you need some help just reach out.
