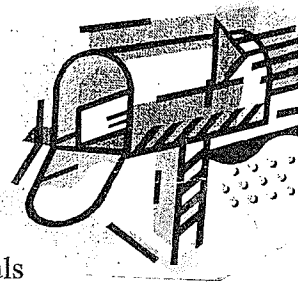

EDITORIAL



After sitting back for a good number of years now enjoying the interesting Editorials provided by committee members, and then all of you obliging, local folk in recent years, I thought I should step up again and give you a potted history of our Express over the last 40 years.

40 Years! Who would have imagined! It certainly doesn't seem that long since Eureka Road resident, Paula Trigg mooted the idea of a monthly community newsletter and called an inaugural open meeting on March 13th, 1980. 13 Residents attended that meeting and as a result the Eureka Express was founded by a small but keen committee of workers, willing distributors, news gatherers and printing staff.

The Hall Committee and the Cull Cow Committee immediately made donations to get things started. The local School was 'on board' and offered the use of its old gestetner in the school library. For 12 years we cranked out by hand all those barely legible issues which had been hand-drawn and typed on stencils.

The advent of our first electric gestetner necessitated moving our printing mornings to the hall in late 1991. A year later, after trying another cheap, old electric model we bought a more modern electric machine, compliments of the defunct local Indoor Bowling Club, and persevered with this machine until grants from WEL Energy and Trust Bank, added our to our History book profits, enabled us in 1996 to go ahead and buy our first photocopier.

What a difference! For a year prior Barbara Thomas had been drawing up the ads on her computer and, thanks to her husband, Neil's generosity, photocopying those pages at Hamilton Plumbing's office. But now we could do the whole job on our photocopier. A band of typists with computers now made a professional job of the copy, and the advertisements and the cover. The E.Express took on a whole new look. We didn't miss getting inky and frustrated but have to admit that our printing time doubled from an average of three hours to at least six! But paper wastage was now virtually nil so that was a plus. (NB: with our present and far more up-to-date copier actual printing time is reduced down to little more than two hours).

After one year in the co-ordinator role Paula and family moved to Australia and Denise Irvine took over the position for the next four years. During this time one of Denise's bigger initiatives was getting Eureka's history recorded and into print – a timely exercise before we lost a whole generation of local historians. Sadly these history books, 'Eureka 1874 – 1984' are now no longer available but I am happy to loan a copy if you wish to read it.

The Easter colouring competition is also a 40 year old tradition,. In 1983 Chris Irvine produced the first local telephone list, another ongoing tradition. For the first nine years of E.Express printing Roger Moltzen was our helpful and supportive school principal and we were also fortunate to have clever and obliging artists and typists like Diane Ammann, Elizabeth Duncan, Diane Hinton and Ria van Vugt who continued for years. Many more lovely ladies have served as treasurers, typists, artists and secretaries in ensuing years and I must mention that our present copy and editorial secretary, Lin Buckley, has held that position now for 35 years! Well done, Lin.

In 1985 I stepped up from Minute Secretary to Editor and have certainly appreciated the support, loyalty and hard work put in over all these years by past and present dedicated committee members, contributors, advertisers, distributors, auditors, Patrons and not least local businessmen, Colin Duncan and Brian Insoll. I should probably here mention and thank my long-suffering husband, Barry, too as his life has also revolved round the monthly printings. A huge thank you to you all. But now let's celebrate and reminisce, sadly at a new date to be advised, due to the escalating COVID-19.

Meantime take care and keep yourselves safe.

TASTE BUDS

Blueberry and White Chocolate Muffins

5oz White Rice Flour
1 tsp Baking Powder
4oz Sugar
6oz White Chocolate Chips
2 Large Eggs
2 tsp Vanilla Extract
1 ripe Mashed Banana

2 ½ oz Corn Flour
Pinch of Salt
3 ½ oz fine Cornmeal
4oz Fresh Blueberries
3oz Melted Butter
9oz Buttermilk



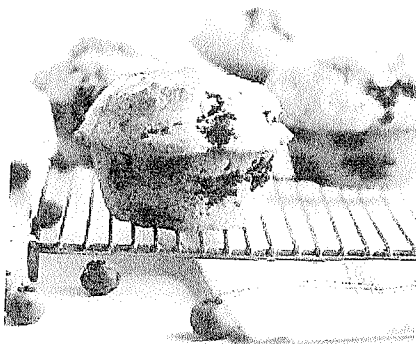
Preheat the oven to 400F/Gas mark 6. Line a 12-case muffin tin with paper muffin cases. Sift together, rice flour, corn flour, baking powder and salt. Stir in sugar, corn meal, white chocolate and blueberries. In another bowl, whisk eggs add melted butter, buttermilk and vanilla. Stir in mashed banana. Make a 'well' in the dry ingredients and pour in the wet ingredients, stir lightly and quickly till just combined. Spoon into muffin cases and bake 20-25 mins until golden, firm to the touch and well risen. Serve warm or cold.

Cheesy Ham and Pineapple Muffins

12 Paper muffin cases
1 tbs Baking powder
200 g of ham off the bone, chopped
1/3 c snipped chives
1 ¼ cups milk
410 can crushed pineapple, drained

2 ½ cups Plain flour
1 tsp salt
1 cup Tasty cheese, grated
1 tbs sugar
60g butter, melted

Preheat oven to 180C. Put muffin cases into muffin tray. In a large bowl, sift flour, baking powder and salt together. Stir in the ham, half the cheese, sugar and chives. Make a well in the center. In a jug, whisk together milk, egg and butter. Fold into the flour mixture then add the pineapple until just combined. Spoon mix into muffin cases bake for 20 mins until lightly golden. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese and bake for 5 mins further. Serve warm or cold.





Who can you trust online?

In a recent expose, Vice (a prominent online lifestyle and technology magazine) showed that antivirus company Avast was collecting and selling all of its free users' web browsing data to other companies such as Microsoft, Google and many others. This means that the company had basically unlimited access to information about your online life, who you wrote to, what you wrote and where you wrote it. This is obviously a huge invasion of privacy, and although the data was supposedly 'anonymised' prior to resale to third party companies, experts believe it could easily be traced back to specific users by some third parties if and when desired. And unfortunately it's nothing new.

Microsoft employees have been caught listening into calls made via Skype, and to audio recordings made through Xbox game machines. Google's anonymous scraping of email data is well-known and used to target advertising to you – as are your search terms when using Google, and data recorded by Cortana (on Windows), Siri (on Apple devices) and 'Ok Google' (on Android phones). But the tactics of Avast – and probably other 'free' antivirus programs made in China like "360 Total Security" - take this dynamic to a whole other level. With minimal effort, a third-party buying this data can find out more about your online life than you yourself remember.

So what to do? Microsoft already tracks your activity within Windows, which is why they are pushing so hard to get users into 'Microsoft Accounts' rather than 'local accounts', so they can tie your data to an individual user. You can turn a lot of this stuff off, if you know how (search online for "Shutup10" to find one good tool for this), but some of it will still get through. I remember a day when using a computer didn't feel like a service, and was more like using a tool. And I dislike the idea of being spied on constantly. Certainly I won't recommend Avast to anyone in future, or Skype – but it seems like it's getting harder to shut these corporations out of our home lives.

As an individual, here are some things you can do:

1. Switch to Linux. For most users, the difference between using Linux and Windows, for basic things like web browsing, downloading pictures and emailing, is minimal. For things like office software, it's a lot different. Of course it takes a bit of getting used to, and if you're a novice it could be daunting, but you also don't need to worry about things like antivirus clients and the like. Linux is a lot more secure than Windows.
2. Stop using Google to search, and use DuckDuckGo instead. DuckDuckGo is one of many search engines which do not track users, and its results are comparable.
3. Switch from Avast, if you're using it, to a better paid antivirus product like Eset's Internet Security, or rely on Windows 10's built-in antivirus instead.
4. When a program asks you whether you want to opt-in to their 'customer experience improvement program', or similar, decline. Untick that box.
5. Don't use Skype, Messenger or Facetime for calls. Try Whatsapp instead, which is fully encrypted end-to-end so others can't spy in.
6. Use Mozilla's Firefox web browser instead of Google's Chrome or Microsoft's Edge. Mozilla is a not-for-profit organisation and does not retain user data.
7. Stop giving money to services which take your data. Don't reward Microsoft or Apple by buying their products.

Personally I'll still use Google occasionally, because I find the search results are better for some things, and I suspect, as nefarious as they are, that they are less nefarious than the likes of Microsoft or Avast. I've personally used Libreoffice, the free and open-source office package, for years and it's every bit as good as Microsoft's offerings, though doubtless very different for those who are used to MS Office. And personally I never recommend Outlook, due to the technical issues I see with it and end users. To an extent there's a give-and-take with this sort of thing – Google only exists because it is able to monetise using your search data and funnel ads to you accordingly. But there is a point at which it becomes debatable that 'free' is worth the cost.

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

– 24 MARCH 2020

As I write this, New Zealand is 36 hours to total lockdown. Who could have imagined we would be in this position when we joined our friends and family for the holiday season less than three months ago? My nearly 95-year-old mother-in-law can't comprehend what is happening – as she said, "there has been nothing like this in my lifetime" and she has lived through a depression, the London Blitz, rationing and blackout of WW2.



Councillors are now working from home. By law, elected members must be physically present in a meeting in order for a quorum to be achieved. When the Government's Alert Level was raised to 3, moving to 4, a decision was made for most Councillors to work from home. Council therefore met today for the last time for four weeks to establish an Emergency Committee comprising the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, and four Committee Chairpersons who will have authority to make urgent decisions if required. The Mayor and CEO will continue to keep Councillors up to date with regular emails and online discussions.

I am still available at any time if you would like to contact me (details below).

Waikato District Council's essential services will continue – rubbish and recycling collection; there will still be safe water for those on District supplies and key staff for urgent maintenance will be on call. Most of our Council staff are working from home; all our offices, community facilities, playgrounds, libraries, camping grounds and community halls are closed. Delivery of some services will change but Council will continue to keep you updated through our website www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz or on our Facebook page. You can still get assistance from our Customer Services team by calling 0800 492 452.

Some other information to be aware of:

- Please do not send anything by post to a Council office. If you need to contact us, please phone or email communications@waidc.govt.nz
- Council's mail delivery service has been cancelled at this stage.
- Anything posted to Council over the past few days may not arrive at our offices.

Other news:

The Eureka/Tamahere Heritage Committee has been granted money to put up signage on historical sites in the two Wards. The design work has been put on hold during the current emergency but we look forward to beginning this project later in the year.

Welcome rain arrived yesterday – 60mls over the last week in Puketaha. However please remember to check online for fire status before you light any fires. www.checkitsalright.nz

No community committees will be meeting in the foreseeable future, but I hope our local groups, community committees, hall committees, heritage committees etc can continue to communicate via email.

Please take care, stay at home and carefully follow the Governments recommendations so the lockdown can be lifted sooner rather than later.
