District News

Navigating national changes

The new coalition Government has announced a flood of major changes that will impact local government. Waikato District Council is watching for opportunities as details emerge over the next few months.

Changes announced include:

- Establishing a National Infrastructure Agency to coordinate government funding, connect investors, and improve funding, procurement, and delivery.
- Developing long-term city and regional deals for infrastructure. These are partnership
 arrangements between central and local government focussed on creating economic growth by
 giving local government the resources to deliver on priority projects.
- Repealing the Natural and Built Environments Act 2023 and the Spatial Planning Act 2023, and introducing a new legislative programme to reform the Resource Management Act.
- Issuing stop-work notices on Three Waters, with assets returned to council ownership.
- Introducing a \$1.2 billion Regional Infrastructure Fund

As we work through the changes — especially Three Waters reform — and as inflation continues to bite and the Capital Goods Price Index (that tracks construction costs and capital assets) soars well above the Consumer Price Index — Council rates will continue to come under strong pressure and are likely to rise. Waikato District Council is reviewing future works plans and budgets to seek savings, but also needs to spend on infrastructure to support growth and to fulfil legislative requirements. Maintaining the right balance is a challenging task.

Local government reform?

As the local government association of New Zealand, LGNZ, says, current funding models for local government are unsustainable, debt is increasing, and so are infrastructure deficits.

Responding to the *Review into the Future of Local Government* which was released earlier this year, LGNZ supports building a new system of government that's fit for purpose; rebalancing the country's tax take between central and local government; creating stronger relationships between local government and iwi; aligning central and local government priorities; and strengthening local democracy and leadership.

It's a bold vision but worthy of support since councils have a critical responsibility for our local communities and their wellbeing.

Construction season – a message from the Mayor



Verner for the construction, an iconic sculpture representing Tauwhare, 'house or place of rest', has been installed next to the Tauwhare War Memorial Hall. Standing several metres tall, it's the realisation of a vision that was first set in motion with the availability of a Waikato District Council arts grant in 2016, and kept alive by the ongoing support of a group of local people. Plantings and a plaque will complete the setting for the work which is expected to be formally celebrated at an on-site function in the New Year.


They call me Ace, I've lived in the Taupiri Eureka area for 70 years.

Who's the driver?

In computing terms, a driver is a little bit of code which sits between the hardware of your computer and the operating system (ie. Windows, MacOS, iOS, Linux, etc). The operating system says to the driver, "do this" and the driver talks to the hardware and says, "do this" and the hardware does that. Simple, right? But easy to get wrong. There's a million buggy drivers out there, for the same reason that there are bugs in programs; computers are predictable but humans are fallible.

So every so often you'll see a program come along and say it can help optimise your computer by keeping your drivers updated; that is to say, it'll check the internet to see if there are newer versions of the drivers you have, and if there are, install them. Leaving aside for a moment the fact that most of these programs are scams, designed to take your credit card or login details, let's focus on the bigger picture. A newer driver isn't necessary a better driver, just like a newer operating system isn't necessarily a better one; the best driver or operating system is the one that's had the most testing.

With Windows, you don't need a driver updater because Windows does that for you. And it'll only roll out new drivers for hardware when it's gone through their extensive testing process. Most hardware manufacturers don't have access to the resources Microsoft have, so generally the drivers they put out don't have the same level of testing. And hence the newer drivers are often the ones with the most bugs. So basically, what I'm saying here is that you should just let Windows do the updating and leave it at that, with some small caveats for items such as 3D graphics cards.

The fact that some bigger firms like Avast offer programs which do driver updates for you, should leave you sceptical about those firms. If a service isn't needed, and is likely to cause issues, why would you pay money for it? The only good driver utility I've used is called Snappy Driver Installer, and I only use it for installing drivers on fresh installs of Windows. Why? Well, it saves you going to the manufacturer websites and doing a bunch of downloading (Snappy creates a local repository of drivers on your hard drive/flash drive).

But there's no cost to Snappy. It's operated by volunteers, and though you can donate if you want, it's a not-for-profit institution. If some software is charging you to update drivers, it's a scam, pure and simple. If you're at the point where you're scrolling through the internet, looking for solutions to your problem, and you're tempted to click on a link to some magical piece of software which promises to fix that problem? Call a professional instead. Those things cause more harm than they fix.


Rural Schools Athletics Day

We are on the lookout for a qualified teacher who can be our part-time admin superstar too. Please see Jo if you know of anyone who would fit this role.

We have run out of plastic bags so please provide your child with a wet bag.

Please do not park in the disabled car park as we do have families that require this park.

We ask that morning drop off with your child/ren happens in the room that they belong to. With our role growing, children being dropped in their own rooms ensures our ratios are being met at all times. This will also avoid children getting upset when they need to go back to their room.

Due to our policy stating we are to be sun safe (particularly) between 9.30am and 4:00pm we ask that you please sunblock your child before you bring them to Preschool. There is always a tub of sunscreen here that you can use if you forget. Thank you.

There will be a little bucket and a packet of wipes in the cupboard under the sign-in sheet; this is for you to wipe your child's face and hands if they have had peanut butter for breakfast. This is following our Peanut Free Policy. Thank you for understanding and following the procedure.

Ladies a Plate

Economical Meringues with Berry Coulis

Ready in 1 1/4 hours plus cooling

Makes about 20 recipe doubles easily

2eggs whites

1 cup castor sugar

1 tsp malt vinegar

1 1/2 Tbsp boiling water

1 tsp baking powder

Berry Coulis

2 cups fresh or thawed frozen raspberries, boysenberries or strawberries

2 Tbsp icing sugar

1Tbsp orange Juice

Preheat oven to 150C fan bake and line two oven trays with baking paper for easy clean up.

Place egg whites in the clean bowl of an electric mixer with sugar and vinegar. When fluffy, add 1 1/2 Tbsp boiling water and beat until glossy and very stiff (about 15 minutes). Mix in 1 tsp baking powder. Drop rounded tablespoons on to a lined oven tray, allowing space in between. Bake at 150C fan bake for 1 hour until crisp. Makes 20.

To Make Coulis If using fresh strawberries, hull and coarsely slice them. Whizz berries or strawberry slices in a food processor or blender with all remaining ingredients till smooth. Pass through a sieve to remove pips. Store in fridge till needed

Super Easy Boysenberry Ambrosia

200g packet Tim Tam biscuits, roughly chopped

425 g can Boysenberries in syrup drained

8 Strawberries (optional)

12 marshmallows cut into squares


1 kg pottle Greek yoghurt with honey

Stir the chopped Tim Tam biscuits and marshmallows into the Greek yoghurt.

Carefully fold through the boysenberries. Spoon into a serving bowl. Garnish with fresh strawberries

Children's Christmas Cooking

Rudolph Oreo Cookie



2 Cups Chocolate Chips

15 Oreos

30 Pretzels

30 Candy eyes (or white small lollies)

15 Red M&Ms

Line a baking sheet with baking paper and set aside

Melt 2 cups chocolate chips in a microwave save bowl

Once the chocolate is melted and smooth, use a fork to place oreos in melted chocolate Tap the oreos on the side of bowl to shake of access chocolate. Place chocolate covered oreos on baking paper.

Place 2 pretzels on the top of the oreos for antiers, place 2 candy eyes beneath them, and finish by placing a red M&Ms beneath the eyes for the nose.

Easy Peasy Rocky Road

400g chocolate (white, milk, plain, or a mixture)

100g Digestive biscuits

100g mini marshmallows (ideally a mix of pink and white)

Line a 23x23cm tin with baking paper. Melt the chocolate in a glass bowl over a pan of just boiled water (Do not allow any water to touch the chocolate) If your bowl fits tightly over the saucepan this shouldn't be a problem. Remove the bowl from the saucepan when the chocolate is fully melted. Place the biscuits in a plastic sandwich bag (or similar). Bash into small chunks using a rolling pin and add to melted chocolate (you may need to transfer to a bigger bowl).

Add the mini marshmallows to the bowl and stir together thoroughly

Transfer the mixture to the lined tin spread the mixture out and then press down using the back of a spoon or similar (i use a potato masher to press the mixture flat, that works really well)

Chill for 1 hour in the fridge, then remove and cut into 16 squares
